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- Community Health Nursing Association of Canada (CHNAC) developed the Canadian Community Health Nursing Standards of Practice (2003).
 - Canadian Nurses Association (CNA) is a national voluntary association that exists to link nurses who work in the same practice area. Will work with CHNAC to create a national certification for CHNs. All provincial associations except Quebec belong to the CNA.
 - Provincial regulatory body and professional associations regulate the profession of nursing in each province.

 Protect the public through maintaining a nursing registry. Professionally advocate for nurses and the public to have a strong publicly funded universal health care system. Promote excellence in nursing practice.

Incorrect: Primary prevention is defined as reducing the risks for a potential problem.

Correct: Secondary prevention includes providing screening, early detection, and treatment.

Incorrect: Tertiary prevention activities focus on maintaining health.

Incorrect: Health promotion is the process of enabling people to increase control over and to improve their health. It is a broad definition and includes the spectrum of health enhancement, health protection, disease prevention, health restoration/recovery, and care and support.

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4. c. Primary health care

Feedback:

Correct: This is the definition of Primary Health Care established in 1978 at the World Health Organization (WHO) Alma Ata conference.

Incorrect: Population health promotion is about creating the conditions that support the best possible health for everyone.

Incorrect: The statement describes primary health care and not global health care.

Incorrect: Disease and injury prevention is just one aspect of the activities undertaken in primary health care.

5. d. Working in a travel immunization clinic

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is an example of group as client as the PHN would be providing health care information to all the students versus the individual student.

Incorrect: Although individuals within the community may access this resource guide, the PHN is serving community as client, which compromises many subgroups and subpopulations in this initiative.

Correct: The most common practice settings for individuals as recipients of public health nursing services are clinics and occasionally homes. A travel immunization clinic is an example of where a PHN would provide health care to the individual.

Incorrect: Family as client is likely the focus of the care provided by the PHN in the home.

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6. d. Significant others for any given person

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is a narrow definition of family that does not include the diverse nature of families such as same-sex partnerships, single-parent families, and many other associations that are examples of family.

Incorrect: This is not an inclusive definition of family because many types of family groupings are not represented in this definition.

Correct: This is a broad definition of family that allows for diversity.

Incorrect: This definition is narrow and does not include the idea that family is any significant others for any given person.

7. b. Community mobilization

Feedback:

Correct: Community mobilization is driven by the affected community, many people are involved, it is more than a single event, and it involves taking action. These elements are evident in this example.

Incorrect: This example is a health promotion strategy, whereas secondary prevention includes activities such as screening, early detection, and treatment.

Incorrect: Lobbying is not social marketing, which is a process for influencing human behaviour on a large scale, using marketing principles in an effort to promote change or modify health behaviour.

Incorrect: This is not an example of downstream thinking.

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8. c. Knowledge of community resources in order to link the client to appropriate resources

Feedback:

Incorrect: This example illustrates the competency of having knowledge of community resources beyond health in order to link the client to appropriate ongoing resources to support her health goals.

Correct: The nurse in this scenario is clearly knowledgeable of resources beyond health in order to promote the client's health goals.

Incorrect: Understanding scope of practice or professional expectations is the definition of a standard and not a competency.

Incorrect: This is a required core competency for a CHN, but this competency is not illustrated in the scenario.

9. c. The work environment

Feedback:

Incorrect: In the 2009 study on community health nursing by Underwood, a barrier to practising to full scope was that there needs to be more professional development opportunities.

Correct: The work environment was identified as an enabler to practising to full scope.

Incorrect: Existing nurse/physician collaboration was identified as a barrier.

Incorrect: Nurses identified a lack of time, money, and access to learning resources as barriers to practising to full scope.

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10. b. Includes the spectrum of health enhancement to disease prevention

Feedback:

Incorrect: This statement does not capture the principles of health promotion, which is a process of enabling people to increase control over and to improve their health.

Incorrect: Health promotion activities do include chronic conditions.

Correct: The World Health Organization (WHO) has a broad definition for health promotion that includes the spectrum of health enhancement, health protection, and disease prevention.

Incorrect: Health promotion activities empower the client to be an active participant and may include other health professionals.

11. d. There has been increased involvement in emergency preparedness planning and education.

Correct: PHNs now take part in emergency preparedness planning and education.

Incorrect: This is incorrect because PHNs are involved in communicable disease control.

Incorrect: Contact tracing is a role of the public health nurse.

Incorrect: Public health nurses have an integral role in large public health initiatives, as do other health professionals.

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12. d. Provides prenatal classes at a community centre

Correct: This is an example of group as client where the health education is relevant to a small subset of the population.

Incorrect: This is an example of family as client.

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is the role of a home health nurse.

Incorrect: This describes the role of the nurse entrepreneur.

Incorrect: A nurse working in the prison system is a forensic nurse.

Correct: This is a unique function of the nurse practitioner.

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14. d. Work with an entire community on a food security policy

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is an example of population as client but is not macro level health promotion.

Correct: This is macro health promotion.

Incorrect: This is not a broad community-based approach to health care and delivery of services.

Incorrect: This initiative is vague and does not specify if the behaviour change is aimed at the individual, population,

or community.

15. b. Caring for survivors of violence including sexual assault

Learning Objective:

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is the role of the mental health nurse.

Correct: Forensic nurses provide care to victims of crime including sexual assault.

Incorrect: This is not the role of a forensic nurse.

Incorrect: This describes the work of a nurse ethicist.

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16. b. Take additional nursing education with a focus on advanced clinical nursing practice

Feedback:

Correct: To become a PHCNP a registered nurse is required to complete additional education, often at the graduate level.

Incorrect: PHCNPs are autonomous in their practice and collaborate with other health care professionals. The additional skills required to function in this role means the nurse must enroll in a nurse practitioner educational program.

Incorrect: There are many opportunities for PHCNPs to work in Canada.

Incorrect: Only after a registered nurse completes a recognized NP education program will the nurse be eligible to write the national examination.

17. c. Recognized by a faith community to carry out an intentional health promotion ministry

Feedback:

Incorrect: It is not a requirement for the FCN to belong to a church or religious organization in order to provide faithbased health care.

Incorrect: Faith healing is not the same as a registered nurse integrating faith and health in practice.

Incorrect: This does not accurately describe the role of an FCN.

Correct: An FCN is a registered nurse who integrates faith and health into practice.

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18. c. Increase the health of the community by preventing disease and promoting healthy behaviours

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is not the role of the public health nurse.

Correct: This is the goal of public health nursing.

Incorrect: This describes the work of a home health nurse.

Incorrect: Although a public health nurse (PHN) will work with marginalized groups, the PHN assumes a generalist

role.

19. b. Giving an influenza immunization

Learning Objective:

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is an example of a secondary prevention activity.

Incorrect: Maintaining client health is an example of a tertiary-level prevention.

Incorrect: This is a screening activity, which is secondary prevention.

Correct: Providing an immunization is a primary prevention activity that reduces the risk for a potential health

problem.

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20. b. Have participants complete a screening tool to determine mental health wellness

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is a primary prevention activity.

Correct: Secondary prevention focuses on early detection of disease or conditions in a particular population.

Screening tests are an effective method of achieving this goal.

Incorrect: A handout on alcohol abuse is aimed at preventing or reducing disease/injury from occurring, which is a primary prevention activity.

Incorrect: Providing information on a well-balanced diet is an example of an educational strategy, which is a primary prevention activity.

21. c. The nurse wears slippers in the client's home in observance of the client's cultural customs.

Feedback:

Correct: This demonstrates respect for the client's cultural customs and shows that care is adapted and mutually agreed upon according to the client's environment and direction.

Incorrect: Adhering to expected standards of practice does not demonstrate the idea that the nurse is a "guest in the house."

Incorrect: This example is based on the nurse's needs and not the client's needs.

Incorrect: This does not demonstrate the concept that the nurse is a "guest in the house" and that care is adapted and mutually agreed upon according to the client's environment and direction.

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22. d. Providing meningitis prophylaxis to a high school in an outbreak situation

Feedback:

Incorrect: This is the domain of a home health nurse and not a public health nurse.

Correct: This is a typical role of the public health nurse ensuring the health of the school community during an outbreak.

Incorrect: A home health nurse would provide this service.

Incorrect: An occupational health nurse works in this capacity.
